### **Expected Attendance:**

Over the 2019 Veterans Day weekend, 4,376 ticketed guests visited the Museum and Memorial and the associated events. This number included 265 people attending the Veterans Day Ceremony and 225 people attending the Walk of Honor Ceremony. We expect similar numbers in 2020:

approximately 4,000 visitors for all the events, 400 people attending the Veterans Day Ceremony, and 250 people attending the Walk of Honor Ceremony.

### Speakers and Activities:

Though our activities have not been finalized yet, we will have similar activities in 2020. The Veterans Day Ceremony will include an honor guard, remarks from selected local and national dignitaries, a keynote speaker, and musical performances. We will also conduct family-friendly activities during the celebration. Some of our previous activities have included a Vietnam-era helicopter, Hands-on-History/Living History, and special research stations.
