The Software includes policies, procedures and training bulletins, is web based and has mobile applications via tablets and smart phones. The Purchasing Department issued Request for Proposal No. 58-20 to meet those requirements. A total of thirteen notifications were distributed and two responses were received, one of which was rejected as non-compliant and the remaining response was evaluated as follows: Lexipol LLC, Frisco, Texas \$130,194 Pursuant to Section 1054.6 of the Jackson County Code, the Sheriff's Office and the Department of Corrections recommend the award of a contract for the purchase and implementation of Policy Management Software to Lexipol LLC of Frisco, Texas under the terms and conditions of Request for Proposal No. 58-20 as the lowest and best proposal received. SUBJECT: Recommendation for RFP 58-20 Policy Management Software

Ms. Casamento,

I am submitting this memorandum to provide the Jackson County Sheriff's Office recommendation reference our request for proposals, RFP #58-20, for Policy Management Software.

I enlisted the assistance of three panelist to evaluate the proposal of Lexipol- 2801 Network Blvd Suite #500 Frisco, Texas 75034 (631) 786-8643 specifically for the product/service offered and the company's experience in qualifications regarding Policy Management. The results of the evaluation, which are favorable to Lexipol, are attached to this memorandum.

To begin the evaluation process I went over the award requirements and the Lexipol response with each of the panelist. The scope of services for the award required the company to create a Law Enforcement/Corrections Policy manual, as well as provide policy updates, web-based delivery platform with accessible mobile application, implementation and training and a supplementary manual. Lexipol provided detailed answers in all areas, including subgroup requirements, advising the company would comply in all required areas if awarded the contract. The company response explained the policies are researched and written by law enforcement professionals and public safety attorneys, their knowledge management system allows manual customization, multiple training bulletins are given to staff monthly, and the program is easily accessed through a web based format. The company also promised real time policy updates through continuous research, as well as implementation and training for staff.

Lexipol provided a list of 4 references in their proposal and I shared information gleaned from each agency with the panelists. Greene County Sheriff's Office Lieutenant Shaw advised his agency has had Lexipol for over 3 years and they are very happy with the services provided. His agency uses both the LE and Corrections manuals and "for time management and professionalism purposes Lexipol was a necessity." He applauded the fact Lexipol automatically sends updated policies as laws change as well as training bulletins and webinar training.

Sergeant Michael Blaylock of the Ascension Parrish in Louisiana said we would be "very satisfied with their services" if we chose Lexipol. West Jordan Utah Police Chief Wallentine advised his agency uses the LE manual and his agency was looking for a manual that once created "they could pick it up and run with it." He liked being able to see when officers completed required training and the fact they could view the content in their vehicles. The Chiefs only regret was that his agency did not buy into their implementation services because it tied up his training unit for almost a year entering the information. Lt. Agderain, of the Clay County Missouri Sheriff's Office, has used the Corrections manual for several years and started using the LE manual a few years back. She advised she wished they would have received both at the same time, which would eliminated cross policies. She further advised they have two persons assigned to manage the program and it takes up about 5% of their work day to add/subtract personnel and review policy updates.

I reached out to officials from Lexipol and requested pricing to include full implementation assistance for both the Law Enforcement and Corrections Manuals, which are attached. Full implementation includes one on one collaboration from their professional services team as they work to review and cross reference existing content, as well as extract unique content for merging with Lexipol content. The price of \$130,194.40 for year 1 includes annual subscriptions to both Law Enforcement and Corrections as well as five tiers of implementation. The proposal includes a 20% professional services discount for both subscription and implementation costs. It should be noted year 2(\$57,856) and year 3(\$60,740) will be the on-going cost for subscription to the software.

In conclusion, I believe Lexipol meets our needs and expectations for a policy management software. Lexipol pledges to provide a fully integrated package of policies, with additional training materials, which represents a significant savings in comparison to the man hours, expertise, and subject matter experience required to formulate a team to create legally defensible policies and procedures. I believe this is the most cost effective way to have access to comprehensive policies, while reducing the cost for man-hours, decreasing risk and cost associated with litigation, and increasing our ability to focus on other agency priorities.
