## SECOND ADDENDUM TO AGREEMENT FOR DISTRIBUTION OF CARES ACT FUNDS

This Second Addendum to the Agreement for Distribution of CARES Act Funds ("Addendum"), entered into this 9<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2021, by and between the undersigned Jackson County, Missouri ("County"), and the undersigned Recipient ("Recipient") an entity which operates within said County (collectively the "Parties").


### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County and Recipient entered into an Agreement for Distribution of CARES Act Funds dated April 16, 2021, ("the Prior Agreement"), whereunder County agreed to provide for reimbursement of certain COVID-19 related expenses; and,

WHEREAS, the Parties now desire to provide for the reimbursement of additional expenses relating to the administration of COVID-19 vaccinations;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the terms and provisions herein contained, County and Recipient respectively promise, covenant and agree with each other as follows:


1. Except as expressly provided herein, all provisions of the Prior Agreement shall remain in full force and effect pursuant to its terms.
2. The maximum sum to be paid by County to Recipient shall be increased by the amount of **\$107,352.00** for a new maximum total of **\$157,052.00** in accordance with the budget attached hereto as Exhibit A.
3. The Second Addendum shall be effective as of January 1, 2021, and shall remain in effect, together with the Prior Agreement and any prior addendums, until December 31, 2021.
4. This Addendum to Agreement, together with the Prior Agreement and addendum, incorporates the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.



Collectively, we serve more than 15,000 individuals each year through community health education and prevention, therapy, service coordination (case management), crisis intervention, in-school services, substance abuse prevention and treatment, domestic violence, violence prevention/intervention for youth, visual arts, civic engagement, youth recreation, and support for adult children with developmental disabilities.</p> <p>Mattie Rhodes' participants represent a predominantly low-income, diverse Latino/ immigrant population experiencing health and mental health disparities. The target population is uninsured (80%), low-income</p>
