





A variety of tools are used to gather data from users, including surveys, workshops/charrettes, focus groups and key person interviews and benchmarking, among others.

Communication, Collaboration and Project Delivery

Our team uses state-of-the-art technology to communicate, collaborate and execute. Throughout the planning and design process, we develop a variety of tools that help to visually communicate design concepts, including 3D models, site plans, floor plans, renderings, fly-through videos and virtual reality models, among others.

From the early stages of our process we are able to engage the project team and stakeholders in virtual explorations of the project. Building Evaluation/Forensics Expertise

SFS has significant experience assessing and documenting the existing conditions of facilities, systems and sites and then developing plans prioritizing needed improvements and outlining strategies for implementing recommended courses of action. This information has been utilized by government agencies to develop capital improvement plans and budgets, as well as strategies for renovating and/or repurposing existing facilities. Assessments have evaluated maintenance history; roof, structure, and building envelope; M/E/P and life safety systems; accessibility; code compliance; security; site; environmental concerns; as well as other exterior and interior issues. Facilities have ranged in size from 2,000 SF to 750,000 SF. Data gathered during the assessments has been compiled and analyzed, issues prioritized, and strategies for improving deficiencies outlined in a final plan report.

Additional experience includes forensic studies related to specific issues, such as roof leaks, deterioration of stonework, window repairs and restoration and exterior envelope analysis.



Repair/Alteration and Whole Building Renovation

Nearly 60% of the work undertaken by SFS involves the renovation of existing facilities. +Projects have ranged in construction value from approximately \$10k to \$55M. Completion: November 2021 (estimated).

Johnson County Mental Health Facilities

JOHNSON COUNTY, KANSAS

SFS evaluated all current (five) Johnson County Mental Health facilities and generated concept design options for the Mental Health space needs program on the five sites. For three facilities, blocking diagrams were developed to illustrate ideas for adapting existing structures to meet the needs. SFS reviewed multiple concepts with Facilities and Mental Health to determine the viable alternatives that met the overall County. Completion: 2020.

Johnson County Courthouse Planning

OLATHE, KANSAS

SFS worked with the County to determine program needs for a new Courthouse and test-fit on two sites adjacent to the existing courthouse. Considerations investigated included the ability to integrate and include secured access for inmates, staff and the public, as well wayfinding and ADA compliancy. Concurrently, the Commission evaluated options to finance and construct the Courthouse. A referendum to fund the project was passed. Complete: 2016.





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Johnson County Arts + Heritage Center

OVERLAND PARK, KANSAS

A compelling, cost-effective and sustainable plan was developed to reposition the 1950s era King Louie bowling alley and ice chateau as a multipurpose County facility. The new Johnson County Arts and Heritage Center preserves an iconic building in the community while meeting the County's needs for a multipurpose community center with office, classroom, and events space, a flexible black box theatre for the County's popular Theatre in the Park program and a new home for the County Museum. Completion: 2017.

Johnson County Park+Recreation District Big Bull Creek Park Police Substation + Maintenance Facility EDGERTON, KANSAS

The new 5,500 SF facility houses a maintenance facility and police substation for Big Bull Creek Park. The police substation includes offices, locker room, interview room that dual functions as ICC 500 rated storm shelter, secured storage with gun safe, among others. The maintenance facility includes offices, tool room, parts room, two service bays, mechanical room and support spaces. An equipment storage barn was also designed. Completion: 2019.

Johnson County Park+Recreation District Kill Creek Park Observation Tower


OLATHE, KANSAS

The new Kill Creek Park Observation Tower, built as a catalyst to draw new patrons to the park, is sited on an alley of trees from the original homestead overlooking the distant views of undisturbed prairie. A series of framed views at each landing builds wonder as the visitor ascends to each level. The galvanized bar-grate skin mimics the everchanging perception through the filtered view of tall Kansas prairie grass. Completion: 2020.


Johnson County Park+Recreation District Meadowbrook Park + Activity Center

PRAIRIE VILLAGE, KS

SFS provided architectural services for the development of the 88-acre Meadowbrook Park. The park is part of a larger redevelopment effort aimed at transforming the former Meadowbrook Golf and Country Club into a mixed-use community. SFS designed several park structures within the park, including picnic shelters, a grand pavilion, restroom building and a new 12,000 SF activity center. Completion: 2019.









Kansas City Detention Center Planning

KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI

The SFS team conducted a needs assessment which involved tracking the workflow throughout the current Kansas City criminal justice system; preparing population forecasts for the next 25 years for the future Kansas City jail population; and assessment of current and potential future utilization of alternative programs and criminal justice system process improvements. Recommendations were also presented in a Final Report. Complete: 2020.

Northland Public Works Maintenance Facility KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI

The SFS team was hired to provide programming, planning and design services for the new Kansas City Public Works (KCPW) Operations and Maintenance Facility in the Northland. The facility will house groups from KCPW District One, including operations, street, maintenance and fleet support for the purpose of providing a flexible and efficient facility for current and future needs of the fleet maintenance and streets departments. Complete: May 2021 (Phase 1 Pre-Design).

Municipal Courthouse Master Plan and Renovation KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI

SFS developed a Building Master Plan outlining renovation and expansion strategies for the aging, four-story, 100,000 SF Kansas City Municipal Courthouse. Renovation strategies are being implemented in phases by SFS. Construction is complete for Phase 1, which involved reconfiguration of the courthouse entrance, relocation and reconfiguration of the Cashiers' counters and relocation of the Prosecuting Attorney's Office and Probation department, among other items. Completion: 2018 (Phase 1).

Wayside Waifs Master Plan, Education and Training Center and Canine Behavior Center

KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI

Master planning, A-E and interior design services for new 16,700 SF facilities and site improvements to the privately-funded, non-profit animal shelter, including a new Humane Education and Training Center with a multipurpose events and training room, and a new Canine Behavior Rehabilitation Center. Completion: 2020.









Blue Springs City Hall Complex

BLUE SPRINGS, MISSOURI

The project addresses the evolving spatial and programmatic requirements of the City, while uniting all departments in one facility. Interior spaces were renovated to provide abundant natural light for staff and to improve workflow and department adjacencies. Much needed meeting and training spaces were added for staff and community use. The new addition provides a two-story daylit entry and new elevator, welcoming the public and improving access for all citizens. Completion: 2019.

Blue Springs Parks Master Plan

BLUE SPRINGS, MISSOURI

SFS participated in the development of master plans for two new parks to serve the Blue Springs community. The Southwest Park Concept Master Plan features a 13,000 SF event building for up to 350 people; restroom building; park shelters; open lawn; trails and play structure. The Roscoe Righter Park Concept Master Plan features a 28,000 SF activity center; park shelters; open lawn; trails; play structure and a dog park. Completion: 2020.

Blue Springs Aquatics Master Plan

BLUE SPRINGS, MISSOURI

The team is engaging the community through surveys and open house meetings, encouraging the public to share their ideas about current and future aquatic amenities. Graphic materials are being generated, including site plans, floor plans and 3D renderings, for presentation to community leaders, other stakeholder groups and the general public in preparation for a referendum to support extending the Parks Sales Tax to fund construction of new aquatic amenities in addition to maintenance of existing aquatic facilities.

Blue Springs Fieldhouse

BLUE SPRINGS, MISSOURI

The underused former Sports City building received a massive overhaul and became Blue Springs' first indoor community recreation center. Features include multi-activity/ basketball courts, artificial turf soccer field, two walking tracks, fitness center, conference/ meeting room, recreation department offices, indoor play area, child watch area, multi-purpose class/meeting/party rooms, spinning/ aerobics space, locker rooms, and concessions.

Completion: 2015; Construction Value: \$2.94M



COVID-19 CARES Act Funded Projects

BLUE SPRINGS, GRANDVIEW AND RAYTOWN, MO

SFS is currently working with several municipalities to implement changes in their facilities utilizing CARES Act funding, including the cities of Blue Springs, Raytown and Grandview in Missouri. Permanent modifications are being made to public/ employee interaction locations, including reception counters, air quality, and entry enclosures, among others. Completion: Ongoing.



Grandview Parks / Public Works Facility

GRANDVIEW, MISSOURI

The new, 21,360 SF facility includes space and functionality for both Parks and Public Works departments and maximizes joint or shared work areas. Natural light is maximized in office and vehicle storage and repair areas through skylights and thermally rated glass. Operations at the site were maintained during construction to ensure continuous service delivery to local citizens and businesses. Completion: 2011.



Legacy Park Amphitheatre

LEE'S SUMMIT, MISSOURI

SFS provided design services for improving the existing amphitheatre to support larger concerts, theatrical performances and other community events at Legacy Park Amphitheatre. Improvements enhance the outdoor performance space by adding a covered stage, backstage support facilities, box office structure, restrooms, concessions, additional seating and walkways as well as expanded parking facilities. Completion: 2016.



Lee's Summit City Hall Complex

LEE'S SUMMIT, MISSOURI

SFS provided programming and planning services for a feasibility study and conceptual master plan, followed by complete architectural and interior design services for the new 76,000 SF City Hall complex. The design of the City Hall reflects the City's desire to create a citizencentered, service-oriented atmosphere and to provide inspiring work spaces for city staff. Completion: 2006.









Oak Grove Aquatic + Recreation Center

OAK GROVE, MISSOURI

The SFS team prepared conceptual plans for a new outdoor family aquatic center, an indoor multipurpose community/recreation space, and renovated Police Department and City Hall. Following a successful referenum, SFS provided full A/E services for a new community recreation/aquatic center complex featuring an 8,000 SF gymnasium and 5,000 SF admissions/ bathhouse/concessions building. Completion: 2018.

Hawk Ridge Park

RAYMORE, MISSOURI

SFS designed several structures in the park, including an amphitheater, restroom building and shelter house. Located across the lake from a new dock and fishing pier, the amphitheater draws people through the park to create a destination gathering place for the community. Recreation Park Activity Center

SFS designed a new 16,000 SF Activity Center to replace the Park House at Raymore's Recreation Park. Raytown City Hall

Under the firm's On-Call contract with the City of Raytown, this project includes design through construction administration for the Phase I renovation of Raytown City Hall. Renovations will follow the final plan produced from the Space Needs Assessment developed by SFS dated July 24, 2020. This phase covers COVID-19 related design including social distancing design parameters, HVAC upgrades to include bipolar ionization systems, and no-touch operation of public restroom sinks, drinking fountains, and entry vestibule doors.

Historic Truman Train Depot Renovation

Currently under construction, the new 11,525 SF station is designed to be expanded to a two-company station as the community grows and the service area densifies. The station is a double depth drive-through facility with primary and secondary exits and return paths. The station will be constructed adjacent to the Blue Valley Southwest grade school campus with opportunities to collaborate on a fire science program as part of the School District's Center for Advanced Professional Studies program. Completion: 2021.

New Police Station

BASEHOR, KANSAS

SFS assisted the City with program confirmation and full A/E and construction administration services for the renovation of the building to accommodate a new Police Station. Associated site work included new drives and parking areas to accommodate 20 staff members and police department vehicles. Completion: 2019.

Government Services Center

BONNER SPRINGS, KANSAS

SFS prepared a master plan for the new Bonner Springs Government Services Center including an existing facilities and site assessment, preparation of a space needs program through 2028, and development of concept plan options. 
