5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, gave an employee of the month award to Pat Murillo, legal secretary in the County Counselor's office. Pat has worked for Jackson County for over 20 years.

She also gave an employee of the month award to Randy Reyes, personnel analyst in the Personnel Department, who has worked for the County for three years.

Katheryn thanked the Legislature for their help over the last two or three years in terms of implementing the salary study and recognizing Jackson County's needs. Their efforts have made it possible for Jackson County to attract and keep good employees.

She announced that Jackson County has won the 2000 Governor's Pollution Prevention Award. We were judged with counties and cities across the state of Missouri for the quality of the programs we have to keep the environment green. Jackson County was given this award because of our recycling program. We now recycle over 20 tons of paper a month. We have expanded the program to include fluorescent light bulbs, motor oil, cardboard and alkaline batteries. It is estimated that we have saved the taxpayers of Jackson County \$185,000.00. We were also judged on the green purchasing we entered into and worked on with the city of Kansas City, our savings to the environment from the chilled water loop, the cooperative environmental efforts we have with local governments and our community rotating recycling centers. The award will be presented on Friday, August 4, 2000 at 3:00 p.m. at the Governor's office in Jefferson City, Missouri. She invited all legislators to attend.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, commended Katheryn Shields on her leadership in working with county departments to address employee issues. Five departments have received salary adjustments for their employees. This is something the legislature and administration will continue to work on in future budgets.
