#### 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said there was an article in the paper yesterday about a minor hero, David Baker, an employee in the Prosecutor's office. He witnessed a mugging this week and chased the suspect. This is an example of Jackson County employees who go beyond what is their job.

Dennis Waits, County Legislator, said David Baker can run faster than anyone you have ever seen and is the best outfielder in the country or he was for a while.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, asked if the Royals knew about this.

Katheryn Shields shared the award that Jackson County received last week from the Governor. He had a very nice event in his office in Jefferson City. The award was for Jackson County's recycling efforts, not just the recycling we do, but the buying of recycled products. She brought members from the recycling committee and asked them to stand and be acknowledged. She thanked the Legislature for supporting Jackson County's recycling efforts each year in the budget by approving contracts with Bridging the Gap.

Katheryn Shields said that Jackson County will be the lead agency requesting and receiving requests from vendors to pick up and purchase recycled materials for Independence, Sugar Creek, Lee's Summit, Kansas City, Blue springs, Grain Valley, Raytown and Jackson County. This is a \$70,000.00 grant from MARC. Bid openings will take place in about 30 days and then it will appear on the agenda for the Legislature's approval.

Katheryn Shields said there is legislation on the agenda dealing with State Probation and Parole. The Administration is bringing this Memorandum of Understanding between Jackson County and the State Probation and Parole office to the Legislature for approval. She thanked the Legislature for their support in their efforts to reach this agreement. The agreement addresses work load, it deals with notification to the courts if event officers have too many cases to monitor, it sets out 24 hour, 7 day a week monitoring and reporting of violations to the courts. She thanked Dora Schriro, Director of the Missouri Department of Corrections, who has worked hard on the language for this agreement. The State Probation and Parole and the courts do have a Letter of Understanding.

Finally, Parks is receiving an Arts Grant from the Missouri Arts Council. It is a \$4,000 competitive grant to provide more musicians for the Missouri Town 1855 Fall Festival of Arts, Crafts and Music. The 25th Annual Fall Festival will be held the weekend of October 7 and 8, 2000 in Fleming Park.
