5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, presented a certificate of accreditation from the National Association of Medical Examiners to Dr. Thomas Young, Jackson County Medical Examiner. Dr. Young began working for Jackson County in July 1995 during a difficult time of transition and he has built an operation of professionalism that serves the citizens and the public of Jackson County very well. The office is now accredited from 2004 - 2009, which is a renewal. The office was first accredited in May 1999. It has only been under Dr. Young's leadership that Jackson County's Medical Examiner's office has achieved this accreditation. She said this is no small achievement. Out of all the medical examiner's offices in the United States, and there are hundreds, only thirty-eight are accredited nationwide. There is only one in the State of Missouri that is accredited which is the Jackson County Medical Examiner's Office. So quoting from a recommendation for accreditation, "The office has been very successful in obtaining excellent support from the County government. The policies and procedures are very well developed and can easily serve as models for other systems." She congratulated him. Dr. Thomas Young said he has been able to achieve this through the generous support of the County Legislature and County Executive. He is very grateful that they have been very generous and kind to him.

Katheryn Shields gave an update on the Public Works Department's testing of bio-diesel fuel. Preserving our environment is very important to her and she knows it is important to the Legislature, because of the support they give for the environmental programs. The Department of Energy calls bio-diesel, "America's fastest growing alternative fuel." Bio-diesel is, basically, soybean oil mixed with regular diesel fuel. The Bio-diesel mixture is only slightly more expensive than regular diesel fuel by itself, and varies by market price. Yet the benefits far outweigh any additional cost. It is a cleaner fuel, which produces fewer emissions to pollute the atmosphere and it appears to help improve fuel mileage and efficiency. This means bio-diesel potentially lowers the wear and tear of the engine.

The Jackson County Public Works Department purchased 62,105 gallons of soy diesel in 2003. Public Works is now evaluating bio-diesel on a trial basis and is coordinating its findings with other similar Public Works maintenance operations in Illinois and Nebraska. So far the results are encouraging. Bio-diesel does apear to help extend engine life which helps make the trucks last longer. The main reason is traditional diesel fuel contains sulfur, a lubricant that cuts down on wear. Sulfur dramatically harms air quality.

Ultimately, bio-diesel has the potential to save tax dollars on repairs of our trucks. For the general public, probably the most visible benefit is reduced emissions. Emissions from a diesel engine are the particulates (thick black smoke). Adding soybean oil to make bio-diesel, really cuts down on those particulates.

She congratulated the Jackson County Public Works Department for its work in this area. Her hope is that bio-diesel will help Jackson County save tax dollars and preserve our environment at the same time.

Katheryn Shields gave a report on "Go Red for Women", which was very successful in Jackson County. We participated in this event to help raise money to fight heart disease and stroke, which are the number one killers of women. The generosity of our employees shined once again. They raised almost \$1,500.00. Jackson County ranked 4 out of 10 local organizations that participated, in total dollars raised. Many of these other organizations are larger, and most are in the private sector.

She wanted to say she is always proud of Jackson County employees, proud of the work they do for our citizens and proud of their generosity of spirit.

Finally, she wanted to remind the Legislature that work inside the building will begin which is included in the 2003 Bond Package. In the budget package there was about \$700,000.00 for internal work which includes the Prosecutor's office, the County Clerk's office the County Executive office and the Grand Entry on the first floor. New security will be set up when this work is completed.

Work will start in a couple of weeks in the Clerk's area. While work is being done in the Executive's area, her staff will move out to the eastern office.

Ronald E. Finley asked the administration for the opinions he requested last week regarding waiver of penalties and interest on property tax bills.

Katheryn Shields said she will work with Bill Snyder, Acting Deputy County Counselor, and get that information to Mr. Finley prior to next week's legislative meeting.
