3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Dan Tarwater III, seconded by Dennis Waits to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on August 22, 2016. The motion passed by a voice vote.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Caleb Clifford, Chief of Staff for County Executive Frank White Jr., apologized the County Executive was unable to attend the County Legislature's meeting due to a previously scheduled conflict. He said with regards to the incident reported last Friday, August 26, 2016, they can not give details due to personnel issues and an ongoing criminal investigation. He said Joe Piccinini, Director of Corrections, was present to go over and discuss things that have been released publicly.

Joe Piccinini said the event came to his attention on Friday, August 26th, but before Corrections staff contacted him they contacted local law enforcement to get them on the scene. He said his department will continue to work diligently with law enforcement until they have an outcome on this tragic situation. He takes this very seriously and explained that an internal investigation is being done as well.

Jackson County Courthouse 415 East 12th Street, 2nd floor Kansas City, Missouri 64106 (816)881-3242 Caleb Clifford stated that members of the Administration, including the County Executive, as well as Department of Corrections staff have been working with law enforcement over the weekend and will continue until a conclusion is reached on this situation and they have determined all individuals responsible.

Crystal Williams asked about the victims who were sexually assaulted at the Regional Correctional Center.

Caleb Clifford responded that he would defer any questions about the victims to the County Counselor.

Stephen Nixon, County Counselor, said since there is an ongoing investigation and they do not have all the facts, they can not discuss it at this time. He said a statement will be released soon.

Caleb Clifford indicated that the Prosecutor's Office is also working on this incident.

Alfred Jordan, County Legislator asked when the investigations will be complete.

Caleb Clifford said they do not know the amount of time needed to complete the investigations. He informed the County Legislature that the County Counselor will hire former United States Attorney Todd Graves to assist with this case.

Dan Tarwater III, County Legislator, asked the Administration's policy for keeping the County Legislature informed because members of the legislature heard about this incident via the media and their constituents.

Caleb Clifford apologized that the County Legislature was not informed about this incident. He said it is their goal to provide information to the County Legislature as soon as they can release it.
