Scott Burnett, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Dan Tarwater III, seconded by Dennis Waits to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on October 09, 2017. The motion passed by a voice vote.

4 HEARINGS

None.

Scott Burnett said he asked the Administration to give a summary today on proposed legislation.

He said the County Legislature has been working with Crissy Wooderson, Legislative Auditor and Troy Thomas, Chief Financial Officer because there are major expenses to be incurred before the end of the year. He said Troy Thomas, CFO and Gary Panethiere, Chief Operating Officer, are available if anyone has questions.

Garry Baker, County Legislator, asked how raises for jail guards will impact other County departments, specifically the Sheriff's department.

Gary Panethiere said he did not have an answer on Sheriff Deputies vs. Correction Officers. He said he knows Troy Thomas is working on it so he will have an answer for the County Legislature next week.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

6 PERFECTION OF PROPOSED ORDINANCES AND REPORTS OF COMMITTEE

A motion was made by Tony Miller, seconded by Dan Tarwater III, to waive the reading of Ordinances #5031 through #5034. The motion passed by a voice vote.

- 5031 AN ORDINANCE amending the zoning districts established pursuant to the Unified Development Code by changing a certain 13.25 ± acre tract from District AG (Agricultural) to District RR (Residential Ranchette). (Land Use Committee - 1st. Perfection)
- 5032 AN ORDINANCE amending the zoning districts established pursuant to the Unified Development Code by changing a certain 12.00 ± acre tract from District AG (Agricultural) to District RE (Residential Estates). (Land Use Committee - 1st. Perfection)
- 5033 AN ORDINANCE amending the zoning districts established pursuant to the Unified Development Code by changing a certain 5.00 ± acre tract from District AG (Agricultural) to District RR (Residential Ranchette). (Land Use Committee - 1st. Perfection)
- AN ORDINANCE renewing a conditional use permit (CUP) in District AG (Agricultural) for a period of twenty years to operate a horse boarding stable, subject to specified conditions as to a 17.5 ± acre tract.

The Land Use Committee will have a public hearing regarding Ordinances #5031 through #5034 on Monday, October 23, 2017 at 1:30 P.M. at the Eastern Jackson County Courthouse, 308 West Kansas, Independence, Missouri on the Ground Floor, Legislative Chambers.

Discussion regarding Ordinance #5035.

Dennis Waits, County Legislator, commented that during budget session months ago, there were some differences of opinions with regards to the undesignated fund balance. The County Legislature suggested looking at bonding the amount to fix all of the items mentioned in the audit report. His concern is we keep dipping into the undesignated fund balance instead of using bonds and keeping the money in reserve for emergencies. Dan Tarwater III, County Legislator, said he did not see the Administration at the meeting. He asked Gary Panethiere, Chief Operating Officer, if he could help answer questions. Dan Tarwater III said the County Legislature has suggested bonding to get the money to build a new jail facility. There is also discussion regarding a vein of limestone that has been studied and may be sold for several million dollars located in Jackson County. Other options include value of property. He asked the Administration about the status of building a new jail because we need to stop throwing money into a hole. Funds are needed to maintain the jail while we build a new one. He is tired of spending more money on the jail with no resolution. The County Legislature continues discussions about a new jail but the Administration has the power to move forward with this project. It is a safety hazard for the public, the inmates and the employees.

Gary Panethiere said HOK did a study and reported that it would cost one hundred fifty million dollars to repair the facility but it would still be inadequate.

Dan Tarwater III said the County Legislature is not interested in that option and wanted to know what the Administration's plans were for the future.

Gary Panethiere said HOK recommended building a new facility which will require land.

Dan Tarwater III asked if the Administration is looking at purchasing land.

Gary Panethiere said there are currently discussions regarding the purchase of land.

Scott Burnett asked if there is a committee in the Administration working on a new jail.

Gary Panethiere said he was not aware of any. He said we will have to operate in the current facility for 3-5 years while we obtain money to build a new facility. He asked how will we finance a new jail.

Dan Tarwater III said Dennis Waits has been working on financing options but no one will listen.

Dennis Waits said it appears the County Legislature is concerned. Scott Burnett and Crissy Wooderson have been working tirelessly on the jail issue for weeks. However, we have not been able to make an impression that this issue has a sense of urgency. The Administration needs to reach out and have good communication with the County Legislature so we can move forward now. All legislators have been working with Scott Burnett and all are ready to help.

Scott Burnett said with regards to increase in pay for the corrections officers, Frank White Jr., County Executive, wants it to be effective October 1, 2017. The County Legislature suggested applying the pay increase January 1, 2018.

Crystal Williams, County Legislator, asked if the County Executive supports building a new jail.

Gary Panethiere replied that he has not heard that the County Legislature supports a new jail without going to a vote of the people.

Crystal Williams said the County Legislature needs the Administation to present proposals. She said there have been public discussions regarding bonding.

Dennis Waits said the County Legislature is in favor of a new jail and is not opposed to going to a vote of the people.

Scott Burnett said he was presented an Ordinance on September 7, 2017 to hire HOK to plan the new jail. He thought this was inappropriate and thinks a committee needs to be established to begin the planning process. He said the good news is they are cleaning and painting each floor of the jail.

Alfred Jordan, County Legislator, said he is weary about a new jail and will think carefully about it.

Dennis Waits said he understands that Alfred Jordan is concerned with increasing the capacity of the jail. However, more room is needed at the jail for exercise, recreation and for the welfare of inmates to prevent overcrowding. This would change the culture of the jail to decrease stress among inmates and employees.

Scott Burnett thanked Troy Thomas for meeting with them. He also thanked Gary Panethiere.
