Scott Burnett, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

#### 1 ROLL CALL

## 3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Dan Tarwater III, seconded by Crystal Williams, to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on February 05, 2018. The motion passed by a voice vote.

#### 4 HEARINGS

Presentation by Rhonda Holman, Chair, and Jovanna Rohs, Vice Chair, of the Community Children's Services Fund. Voters approved an eighth of a cent sales tax in November 2016 to create a fund to provide services for children related to behavioral and mental health. This sales tax went into effect in January 2017. This fund may be used to treat children up to the age of 19 years old. It is projected that the fund will have approximately \$11 - \$15 million for these programs in the first year. Greg Grounds, Legislator, asked how much the Board had allocated for administrative costs. Ms. Holman stated that presently \$7,500 is being spent for a contract with the Greater Kansas City Community Foundation to provide assistance to the Community Children's Services Board, which is made up of all volunteers. The Board is currently conducting a nationwide search for an Executive Director, but presently they have no staff.

Theresa Galvin, Chair of the Inter-Governmental Affairs Committee, introduced Fred Dreiling, Chief Inter-Governmental Relations Consultant, and Noel Torpey, Assistant Inter-Governmental Relations Consultant.

Mr. Dreiling indicated that the number one issue they have been dealing with is the per diem the County receives from the State of Missouri for inmates held on state charges in the County's Detention Center. Currently the reimbursement is \$22.58 per day, but is at a cost to the County in the amount of \$90 per day. He stated that Missouri is behind on its payments and he believed the issue may require all counties in Missouri to sue the State for the reimbursement of these costs.

Mr. Torpey reported on the 911 bill. This bill would enable a fee on cell phones to cover the costs of the 911 emergency service. Currently in Missouri, the 911 fee only applies to landlines. Mr. Torpey stated that this bill, sponsored by Representative Jeanie Lauer, has passed the House each year, only to become bogged down in the Senate on the issue of consolidation of services.

Mr. Dreiling also reported on the matter of Missouri's prevailing wage law. He stated the push to repeal the prevailing wage law is likely to pass the Missouri House but may not get through the Missouri Senate.

Mr. Dreiling addressed the issue of stadium funding, stating that funding from the State of Missouri will end in 2021. With tight funding, tax cuts at the state level, and this being an election year, it is unlikely that the County will see relief on this issue in 2018. He stated that the St. Louis Blues Hockey team is looking for additional revenue streams and it is likely that one of the Jackson County senators will add an amendment to any such bill to include our stadiums.

Scott Burnett, Chairman of the Legislature, announced that the opening day for election filing is February 27, 2018. He stated that any candidates wishing to file on opening day will enter through the west doors facing Oak Street. The doors will open at 7 a.m. The County Clerk's Office will have an associate present to distribute numbers to filers as they enter. Filers will then be allowed to proceed to the second floor to line up outside the glass doors to the Clerk's Office. The Clerk's Office will open at 8 a.m. for filing.
