Scott, Burnett, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Dan Tarwater III, seconded by Dennis Waits to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on May 21, 2018. The motion passed by a voice vote.

4 HEARINGS

Resolution #19889 was adopted at this time. See page 8 for details.

Scott Burnett, Chairman, introduced Jean Peters Baker, Jackson County Prosecuting Attorney, to speak regarding the May 11, 2018 grand jury report related to the Jackson County Detention Center. Jean Peters Baker stated that she sent a letter to the Legislators and the County Executive asking that action be taken to move control of the jail to the Jackson County Sheriff. She said she does not seek conflict but that it is her duty to look after those incarcerated at the jail. While she does not expect such a change to fix the problem overnight, this move would be a step in the right direction. She said that she believes if positive action is not taken immediately that a federal judge will step in and issue a decree related to oversight of the jail. She expressed her support for the recent efforts of the Facilities Management Division of the Public Works Department to make improvements to the facility, but the management issues still need to be addressed.

Jackson County Courthouse 415 E.12th Street, 2nd floor Kansas City, Missouri 64106 (816)881-3242 Jean Peters Baker stated that some of the grand jurors were present at the meeting and wanted to speak. She said there is no prohibition for them to come forward on their own.

Dan Tarwater III, County Legislator, stated that he was disheartened with the response from the administration regarding the hard work of these grand jurors. He stated they spent hours of time away from their families and missing work without any hope of compensation or reward for their work. Mr. Tarwater stated that change is needed and he calls on the County Executive to support the move of the jail under the Sheriff's control.

Greg Grounds, County Legislator, stated that while there were some technical problems with the Charter Amendment ordinance, he continues to support having this provision included in the ordinance.

Three members of the grand jury came forward to speak. John Johnson stated that he was disheartened to read the comments by Mr. White about the grand jury. He said it was their goal to keep politics out of their process. He stated that as grand jurors they recognize that many people are trying to do the right thing but found that the leadership was attempting to deflect responsibility.

Grand juror B.K. Christopher said that while she doesn't see the jail's issues as any one person's fault, building a jail is not going to solve the problem unless you fix how you're running it. She added that serving on this grand jury was one of the most rewarding experiences of her life. She stated, a health jail is vital to a healthy community.

Grand juror Steve Martin stated that it was a privilege to do this work. He said that they had some of the brightest people available speak before the grand jury and they were careful to back up all of the information presented in the report by information from those who testified.

Dan Tarwater thanked the jurors for their service. He stated that while a new jail is needed, they can't build it overnight and the first step is to improve the management of the jail to start moving in the right direction.

Dennis Waits, County Legislator, also expressed his thanks to the jurors. We continue to have mismanagement at the jail, despite some improvements, but it is not enough. There is a void in leadership.

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Theresa Galvin, County Legislator, expressed her thanks to the grand jurors for their work and time they spent away from their families.

Alfred Jordan, County Legislator, stated that he appreciates the breathe and depth of the grand jury report. He stated that this situation has proven to be frustrating to the Legislature.

Garry J. Baker, County Legislator, also expressed his thanks to the jurors. He said that in his short time on the Legislature there had been much talk and now he encouraged action to be taken.
