3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Dan Tarwater III, seconded by Dennis Waits to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on July 16, 2018. The motion passed by a voice vote.

4 HEARINGS

Dan Tarwater III, County Legislator, gave an update on Jackson County's Pension Plan. He said they have been working on changes in the pension plan for the Sheriff's Department and would like to look at other departments in the future. It is back in the hands of the Pension Board because the Fraternal Order of Police asked for 10 year vesting instead of 5 year vesting, which makes the pension plan stronger. He said it is not true that this change will make it worse for other county employees. He said hopefully this legislation will be before the County Legislature within the next couple of weeks.

Dennis Waits, County Legislator, asked for an update on the courthouse security pass for members of the Kansas City Metropolitan Bar Association (KCMBA). Captain Tuttle with the Sheriff's Department said Colonel Kenney has been working with the KCMBA and he will ask him to give an update to the County Legislature.

Captain Tuttle said he would relay the message to Colonel Kenney.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Caleb Clifford, Chief of Staff, said the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for 2017 was delivered today to the legislators and there will be a hearing next week. He said Bob Crutsinger, Director of Finance and Cheryl Colter, Deputy Director, will be contacting legislators this week to go over the report and address any questions they have prior to the hearing.

He said tomorrow is the second community input meeting for the Criminal Justice Task Force at the Hillcrest Community Center at 5:30 P.M.

Caleb Clifford thanked Crystal Williams, Scott Burnett and Alfred Jordan, County Legislators, for their support of the insurable title project. He said this is an important project and the administration is aware and shares concern regarding potential costs.

Resolution #19919 was taken up at this time. The County Legislature interviewed candidates for the Jackson County Sports Complex Authority.

Allan Gray II was present and said he is a Democrat and his taxes are paid. He said he is a lifelong resident of Jackson County and was the former mayor pro tem of Lee's Summit, Missouri.

John Modest Miles was present and said he is a Democrat and his taxes are paid. He is the pastor of Morning Star Church and is reapplying for his position on the Sports Complex Authority.

Dan Tarwater III, County Legislator, thanked Rev. Miles for his service on the Jackson County Sports Complex Authority.

John Boyd was present and said he is a Democrat and his taxes are paid. He is an attorney, he lives in Lee's Summit, Missouri, he is counsel to the National Football League Players Association and he represents labor throughout Missouri.

Shomari Benton was present and said he is a Democrat and his taxes are paid. He is an attorney and is involved civically. He said he has a passion for the city and he was born and raised in Kansas City, Missouri. Scott Burnett said the County Legislature will interview anyone else who is interested in serving on the Jackson County Sports Complex Authority at the legislative meeting scheduled to be held on Monday, July 30, 2018 at 2:30 P.M. in the Kansas City Legislative Assembly Area.
