#### 10 INTRODUCTION OF PROPOSED ORDINANCES AND ASSIGNMENT TO COMMITTEE

Scott Burnett read a statement pertaining to Ordinance #5127. He said the needs of Seniors across Jackson County are growing while at the same time resources are shrinking. In addition to establishing a Senior Services Fund we continue to look for solutions that fit our community which provide for Senior health and wellness needs.

After taking into consideration the large number of ballot issues on the November 2018 ballot, and the fact that some of those propose a raise in a current tax or are proposals for a new tax, we made the decision to move our ballot issue to a date in 2019. Due to the critical needs of Seniors in our community we want to ensure the voters are able to focus on this issue and be informed in the vote they cast.

We appreciate the support of the Jackson County Legislature for caring about Seniors in our community and their willingness to work with their colleagues on the County Legislature to address the needs of Seniors.
