Scott Burnett, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

1 ROLL CALL

2 THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Dan Tarwater III, seconded by Dennis Waits to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on August 27, 2018. The motion passed by a voice vote.

4 HEARINGS

Public hearing on Resolution #19965 expressing the intent of the Legislature that Jackson County reverse all prior voluntary reductions of property tax rates.

Copies of a PowerPoint presentation were distributed to members of the County Legislature. (Available in the Clerk of the County Legislature's office.)

Ed Stoll, Chief Administrative Officer, spoke in favor of Resolution #19965. He said there are numerous substantial needs for additional revenue. Foremost, the need for a new jail facility with early estimates coming in at a minimum of \$10MM - \$12MM annually for 30 years. The current jail requires repairs, upgrades and operational improvements pending the new jail facility. If additional revenue funding remains, the County Legislature could use the monies to address numerous other needs of the County, including: upgrades/repairs to address deferred

maintenance and lack of improvements in other physical facilities such as elevators and fire suppression systems; software and systems upgrades to improve operations and efficiency and ultimately cost savings; and ensuring that all County associates are paid a fair and competitive wage.

Ed Stoll said the Administration would like to work together with the County Legislature to meet these challenges.

Ed Stoll discussed the PowerPoint presentation. He said Jackson County has had voluntary reductions in the tax levy rates four times in the past 10 years. He said un-reversed voluntary reductions have cost Jackson County more than \$165MM in lost revenue over this time.

He said the timeline for legislative action is to adopt Resolution #19965 today, to introduce an ordinance for the tax levy rate for Jackson County on September 17, and to have a public hearing and adopt that ordinance on September 24, 2018.

Ed Stoll stressed that the failure of the County Legislature to act on this legislation today will result in lost revenue and possible future restrictions. He suggested funding priorities for additional revenue from this recommended course of action should be the new jail facility, current jail repairs/upgrades, operational improvements, and other County needs as determined by the County Legislature.

Frank White Jr., County Executive, said he supports Resolution #19965. He said this is the best way to address the County's current needs.

Ed Stoll confirmed that the additional revenue estimate is \$19.5 MM.

Scott Burnett said Ed Stoll sent a document to the County Legislators regarding the additional funding. It was a draft of an addition to the Jackson County Code that can be adopted by ordinance to change Chapter 5 of the Code to establish an Adult Correctional Institution Fund.

Dennis Waits, County Legislator, asked Ed Stoll for a plan showing where the funds will be placed and used.

Greg Grounds, county Legislator, suggested that elected officials be prepared to explain the increase when constituents receive their tax bills. He said the expenditures should be primarily for the jail since it is such a pressing issue. He said he does not see any other realistic avenue to generate money to address the jail. *Crystal Williams, County Legislator, asked if there was any value in the County Legislature having hands on the different mechanisms to fund the jail in the most equitable ways.*

Dennis Waits said the use tax is a good mechanism to generate revenue. The Administration has looked at this and believes that the use tax, based on current spending trends, may not be as reliable as once thought.

Crystal Williams said a use tax is layered. She said based on the explanation given she agrees it should stand on its own.

Alfred Jordan, County Legislator, asked why Jackson County did the rollbacks.

Dan Tarwater III, County Legislator, explained that in 2008 and 2009 the rollback was due to the economic times. At one point, he said, 40% of home sales were foreclosures. The reduction of the tax levy was to help citizens in Jackson County, Missouri. He said that by setting up a separate account fund for these additional revenues we will be receiving as a result of Resolution #19965, we have a plan to use the funds for the jail as they will not be a part of the General Fund. He said we need help not only with the jail but also with the Assessment Department.

Tony Miller, County Legislator, said he will explain to his constituents that it is the most direct route to deal with the jail.

Garry Baker, County Legislator, asked Ed Stoll if this would also affect personal property tax as well.

Ed Stoll said it would affect personal property but no figures have been estimated.

Theresa Galvin, County Legislator, said there are other facility issues besides the jail that need to be addressed, such as the elevators in the Kansas City Courthouse and raises for lower grade county employees. She said she agrees with Crystal Williams about the need for oversight of any specially created account fund.

Scott Burnett asked Ed Stoll to send a breakdown of how the funds will be used to all legislators.

Tony Miller asked if there were any restrictions on how the monies can be

spent.

Jay Haden, Chief Deputy County Counselor, said the only restriction on expenditures is the provision within the Health Fund that states once we start using Health Fund monies, you cannot go back to using General Funds for that purpose. He said this plan will be a creature of county government and not state law and can be adjusted to meet Jackson County needs as the fund is a subset of the County General Fund.

Dennis Waits said the Administration is committed to the jail. He asked if the County Legislature can monitor this in the future if a new Administration did not feel the same way.

Jay Haden said the ordinance can be modified and subject to the annual budget process.

Alfred Jordan asked about page 16 of the PowerPoint presentation. He asked if the amounts in the other funds such as the Health Fund and Road and Bridge Fund were flat?

Ed Stoll responded that the other funds would have slight increases.

With no one else present to testify, the public hearing was closed.

Frank White Jr., thanked the County Legislature for listening to the Administration's presentation.
