3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Dan Tarwater III, seconded by Jalen Anderson to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on August 12, 2019. The motion passed by a voice vote.

4 HEARINGS

Scott Burnett, County Legislator, and David Bass, Marina Supervisor, presented each other with 20-year service pins.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

County Executive Frank White Jr. gave an update about the sale of the Arrowhead Stadium seats. He said that during the first weekend of the sale 1,600 seats were sold. The proceeds of the sale will benefit the Parks + Rec Department's accessible playground equipment. The website to purchase seats is arrowheadseatsale.com. He said the cost of a single seat is \$199.00 and \$399.00 for a pair with the Arrowhead logo on the side. *Mr. White thanked the Legislature for its support.*

Theresa Galvin, Chair, invited Presiding Judge David Bryn to provide an update. Judge Byrn said that his office had distributed to the Legislators a copy of the letter he sent to the administration regarding his frustration with the County's elevator situation. He said that the elevators are one part of a much bigger problem. The County has had problems with the elevators before and will have problems with the elevators again. His frustration stems from the lack of a contingency plan and a solution to this problem if the elevators go out again. He said that he has identified many problems that could be managed right now, including removing the damaged carpeting and ceiling tiles. He said that these problems impede the court's ability to complete its work and this is a problem for both taxpayers and litigants. He said that he understands there is a lot going on, but his frustration continues. He acknowledged meeting with Public Work's Department representatives to select new carpet for the third floor.

Dan Tarwater III, County Legislator, asked if Judge Byrn is given regular updates about the progress of the repairs. Judge Byrn said that while he does get regular updates on some matters, he is not looped in on everything going on.

Brian Gaddie, Director of Public Works, said that he meets every week with court personnel. He said that the broken elevator would be fixed by Monday, and it was repaired on time. Judge Byrn said that he wants action, he wants to get things done.

Theresa Galvin, Chair, asked Mr. Gaddie about the plan going forward. Mr. Gaddie said that they have extended the Request for Proposals period for the elevator RFP. They are confident they will receive responses from at least four of the five top elevator companies.

Caleb Clifford, Chief of Staff, said that there is only so much the County can do in the event all elevators go down. He said they have discussed a plan to issue an RFP for alternative space for the courts in case of an emergency.

14 NEW BUSINESS

Jalen Anderson, County Legislator, expressed his frustration with the press release issued by the County Administration last week. He said that he had 50 calls from constituents about the press release. He said that the committee of state legislators was formed and had met recently, but that no one from the Administration attended. He said that all of the things recommended by the Administration were things that had already been discussed previously. But these suggestions will not solve anything this year. If we do nothing though, people will lose their homes. Mr. Anderson said, let's not have a press release suggesting that this can be changed simply by issuing a press release. We need to be better at messaging.

Jeanie Lauer, County Legislator, said that there is no expectation that this issue will come up during the veto session next month.

Frank White, Jr., County Executive said that the press release was meant to find solutions before the next reassessment cycle. He said that everyone in his administration is concerned about the issues raised by the reassessment and would not intentionally risk the health and welfare of the citizens of Jackson County. He said that he did not believe the press release to be negative. It was his intent to be proactive. He said he had a lengthy conversation with Representative Coleman who advised that there was no need for the County Executive to attend the meeting of state officials to discuss the County's assessment issues. Mr. White said that he is frustrated with news articles and other posts that place blame on the County Executive for everything that has happened in the County.

Dan Tarwater III, County Legislator, said that it is the County Executive that runs the day-to-day business of the County.

Jalen Anderson said that he wants to move forward together and recommended that all parties reach out to the Governor's office.

Jeanie Lauer said that she serves on the board of the Missouri Association of Counties and that this is not just a Jackson County issue, but a statewide issue.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, said that everyone must stop the finger pointing and move forward in a positive way.

Tony Miller, County Legislator, said he wanted to recognize the City of Independence, Charlie Franklin, Jaime Masters, and Mark Trosen for their hardwork in getting Proposition P passed in Independence to help fund the Regional Animal Shelter. Scott Burnett, County Legislator, asked Jay Haden, Chief Deputy County Counselor, if the passage of Resolution #20219, amending the Rules of Legislature, would go into effect immediately. Jay said that it would. Theresa Galvin instructed the Clerk of the Legislature to notify Judge Bushur that the fourth meeting of the month will no longer be in Independence.

Ronald E. Finley asked Jaime Masters for follow-up information regarding the vaccination policy in Jackson County. Ms. Masters said she will have an update next week.
