Theresa Galvin, Chair, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Dan Tarwater III, seconded by Scott Burnett to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on September 30, 2019. The motion passed by a voice vote.

4 HEARINGS

None.

5 COMMUNICATIONS WITH AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Ed Stoll, Chief Administrative Officer, said Frank White Jr., County Executive, regrets that he is unable to attend the legislative meeting today. He said that representatives from the Kansas City Public School District were present and wanted to speak to Resolution #20274.

Crystal Williams, County Legislator, asked Mr. Stoll if the Administration had asked the school district to come to the meeting today.

Mr. Stoll said that it was the request of the County Executive to have them understand the impact on the school district if the assessed values were rolled back to the 2018 levels.

Crystal Williams said that was fascinating information to her because the

Office of **Mary Jo Spino** Jal Clerk of the County Legislature Scott I County Executive also sent out a press release calling on the Kansas City School Board to roll back their levy in order to accommodate the heightened assessments. She said she was confused because many of the school districts had called today thinking there was a tax hearing or a discussion of policy.

Tony Miller, County Legislator, said that he had similar conversations but once he walked through the procedures and explained that this was simply a messaging campaign, the school district representative decided not to come to the meeting. He said that once he walked through the information with the suburban district it was clear that there was no forest fire.

Crystal Williams said that we all know that there is no vote on actual tax policy that is going to impact the school district. This resolution has no power to change anything. Yet again the school districts are being used as a pawn.

Theresa Galvin said that Resolution #20274 is a courtesy resolution and has no power to change anything. She said that she found it insulting.

Jeanie Lauer, County Legislator, said that while she understands that this courtesy resolution does not mandate anything, she believes it gives a level of false hope. From a policy standpoint she said, the resolution has not been vetted properly from the taxing entities and it is therefore not good policy and could be setting the County up for liability.

Dan Tarwater III, County Legislator, said that the only reason this was up for reconsideration today is because he wanted to add additional information to the body of the courtesy resolution, and this was the only way to revise what was adopted last week.

A motion was made by Dan Tarwater III, seconded by Scott Burnett to reconsider Resolution #20274. The motion passed by a voice vote.

Discussion.

Crystal Williams said this resolution is the Legislature saying that they think there were problems with the reassessment. The problems now are that people have filed appeals months ago and haven't heard anything and that people are having no notice of their hearing date. The Board of Equalization process is going to go on through the first of the year and taxpayers will have to pay under protest, but they still have to pay. If the taxpayer does not pay, the County will impose penalties and interest. She said that everyone needs to understand the level of fear among their constituents.

Scott Burnett, County Legislator, added that even for those taxpayers that have their values lowered by the BOE, it may be months before they are able to get a refund of their overpayment.

Dan Tarwater said that he was surprised by the number of calls this morning. He said that they, as Legislators, represent the taxpayers. He said they have been talking about this for months and have been unable to get the Administration to recognize that there are errors in the system. The data put into the system was wrong and that increased values 200, 300, and 400 percent in some cases.

Scott Burnett said that in fairness to the BOE, the hearing officers are helping and are successful at rapidly reviewing cases and bringing matters to the BOE. He said that he still thinks it will be months before this is complete.

Theresa Galvin said that she has heard that even if the BOE reduces a value, taxpayers are still going to get a bill from the County for the original value.

Ed Stoll said that the Collection Department is going to help figure these questions out.

Tony Miller suggested that it might be helpful to have a sit down in a different forum with the taxing entities to address their concerns.

Theresa Galvin invited one school district representative to come forward to address any concerns with this resolution.

Linda Quinley, Chief of Finance and Operations with the Kansas City Public School District, came forward to speak. She said she understands this is a long and difficult process. She said that rolling the assessment values back would have a detrimental impact on the school district's budget. These funds also serve as a pass through for the charter schools in Kansas City. She said they support the appeal process and they are hopeful the process is fair and valid.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, asked Ms. Quinley about the impact on the school district of tax financing agreements by the City of Kansas City for hotels and other new construction. Ms. Quinley stated that these actions by the City cost the school district about \$30 million.

Tony Miller said that he was concerned about the impact on the school district of taxpayers losing their homes and being forced out of the district by the reassessment process.

Crystal Williams said that she is disappointed that the school district representatives are here speaking in support of an unfair reassessment by the Administration that is going to force more people into homelessness in our community.

Theresa Galvin asked for a report from the Administration regarding fixing the issue of taxpayers not receiving their notice of hearing before the BOE in a timely manner.

Ed Stoll said that they are working with the Assessment staff on rectifying this situation and he will have an update next week.
