#### 2 THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

# 3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Scott Burnett, seconded by Jalen Anderson to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on February 03, 2020. The motion passed by a voice vote.

#### 4 HEARINGS

Dan Tarwater III, Chair of the Inter-Governmental Affairs Committee, introduced the Legislature's Chief Inter-Governmental Relations
Consultant Fred Dreiling and his associates, Cara Hoover and Noel
Torpey. Mr. Dreiling said the state continues to be behind in its per diem reimbursement for State prisoners. Currently the state is \$36 million behind in reimbursements to counties for prisoner per diem, with Jackson County being owed about \$4 million. The Governor and the State Senate appear to be in agreement that some funds should be allocated in the budget to reduce this amount. There are concerns that the Missouri House does not support any efforts to meet this cost and the County may want to consider possibly suing the State of Missouri over these funds. Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, asked Bryan Covinsky, County Counselor, to investigate the feasibility of such a lawsuit.

Mr. Dreiling said there are seven bills in the Ways and Means Committee exploring changes to the County's reassessment process. He has not yet testified for or against any of the proposed measures, which includes possible changes as to whether the County's assessor is appointed or elected, the requirement for physical inspections of properties with an increase in assessed valuation of 15% or more, and a possible cap of the maximum amount of an increase of assessed valuation. Mr. Tarwater requested that County Legislators email him their thoughts about these potential changes so that the Inter-Governmental Affairs Committee can consider the Legislature's response and direction for Mr. Dreiling and his associates.

Mr. Dreiling said that they are hopeful that the "Wayfair Bill" which imposes a tax on internet sales, will pass this year. He said estimates are that the state loses \$600 million in tax dollars each year.

Mr. Dreiling added that there are efforts at the state house to change the "Clean Missouri" constitutional amendment that was adopted by voters last year. Some at the capitol believe that voters did not understand what they were voting on when this amendment was adopted.

Mr. Torpey said that he is cautiously optimistic that the state will pass a Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP). Missouri is the only state without a PDMP and despite the Conservative Caucus's opposition to this program, there is considerable movement in Jefferson City to get this done this year.

Other issues expected to be discussed this session include a possible Medicaid expansion, which may be on the ballot as a petition ballot measure, and retail sale of marijuana for recreational use.
