3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Dan Tarwater III, seconded by Tony Miller to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on February 10, 2020. The motion passed by a voice vote.

4 HEARINGS

Theresa Cass Galvin, Chairman, presented Tony Miller, County Legislator, with his five-year service pin.

Dan Tarwater III, County Legislator, presented Theresa Cass Galvin with her five-year service pin.

Theresa Cass Galvin presented Dan Tarwater III with his twenty-five year service pin.

Angie Jeffries, Director of Communications, introduced the communication plan to educate the public and associates on the upcoming construction to the downtown courthouse. This plan will manage citizen and associate expectations throughout the construction process. She also introduced Richard Buford with the GIS Department who gave a brief presentation. The Communications Director is participating in meetings with the Public Works Department to coordinate internal and external information.

The Communications Department is working with the Information Technology Department to create a directory on the ground and first floor to assist the public in identifying where they need to go. This will help reduce elevator traffic.

Updates on the construction will be posted on the County's website, social media, and signage in the building. The social media campaign will utilize interviews, construction video and photos, and information residents and associates will need before coming to the courthouse.

Communications is partnering with the Human Resources Department for an incentive plan for associates to opt to take the stairs to improve health and fitness while reducing elevator traffic.

The elevator doors will feature photos to showcase our Parks + Rec Department, creating a visually appealing image while waiting for the elevator. 5 COMMUNICATIONS WITH AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Theresa Cass Galvin, Chairman, asked Jay Haden, Chief Deputy County Counselor, to provide additional information regarding two employment contracts for Deputy Medical Examiners that have been filed with the Clerk's Office. She referred to Article V, Section 10., dealing with the Medical Examiner. Mr. Haden stated that these contracts did not include any provisions that were outside of the County's personnel rules and therefore, in his opinion, did not require Legislative approval. They did not include a severance package but did include additional vacation.

Dan Tarwater III, Vice Chairman, said the legislators are not opposed to hiring these employees. His concern is that the contracts fail to set a term for employment and the County Executive and County Legislature have agreed to diminish employment contracts.

Jay Haden explained that the employees would serve at the pleasure of the Medical Examiner. He said the County Administrator was also questioned regarding this issue. He said he will discuss this with Mr. Schulte within the next couple of weeks to consider a policy change.

Troy Schulte, County Administrator, said given the amounts of these contracts (\$230,000 and \$240,000) he assumed they would need legislative approval. He said they were prepared as contracts because the salary levels are above the compensation scale.

Jay Haden said Ordinance #5316 pending before the County Legislature would put them within the compensaton scale and the contracts would be effective in June and August 2020. If the ordinance does not pass, the contracts would not be effective. Theresa Cass Galvin asked if this is clear and in writing. Mr. Haden said he was not sure.

Dan Tarwater III said Ordinance #5316 will be withdrawn today because the Administration is working on an amendment not because of this discussion.

Ron Finley, County Legislator, asked Troy Schulte for information about the coronavirus.

Mr. Schulte said Jackson County's response if there is a coronavirus patient identified in Jackson County is the patient would be quarantined at KU Medical Center (KUMC). He said they are waiting for further guidance from the Center for Disease Control (CDC) regarding an additional quarantine facility in the event KUMC reaches capacity. Jackson County will be notifying Primary Care Physicians of this plan through our Health Department. This is a countywide plan that will affect all jurisdictions within Jackson County, Missouri. There will be more information depending on the magnitude of an outbreak.

Jeanie Lauer, County Legislator, revisited the previous discussion regarding contracts and said she would like a policy decision regarding employment contracts.
