Theresa Cass Galvin, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

1 ROLL CALL

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Dan Tarwater III, seconded by Scott Burnett to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on June 29, 2020. The motion passed by a voice vote.

4 HEARINGS

Brian Gaddie, Director of Public Works, introduced the JCDC Partners, LLC team, Dr. Troy Nash and Karl Becker, and Wendy Ware, Chloe Jaco, and Rick Davidson via Skype. Dr. Nash and his team presented the report of their finding on Phase 1, Validation of Jail Needs. Tony Miller, County Legislator, asked if the team had considered options related to work release and beds for shock time, such as in felony DWI offenders, that would allow for additional classifications of offenders. He also mentioned a therapeutic community center like the one in Johnson County, Kansas. He added that it does not appear this plan includes any municipal beds. Brian Gaddie said that the project team has an outreach group, but there has not yet been a great deal of interest for community partners. But, he said, there is still flexibility in the plans. Karl Becker said they would consider these types of optional programs.

Jeanie Lauer, County Legislator, asked if this plan takes into consideration a campus design that would include a workforce development program and mental health needs. Mr. Becker said they plan to include flexibility in their plans to consider this format.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, asked Brian Gaddie about the deferred maintenance plans and how that will impact the budget. Mr. Gaddie said in 2018 when the Public Works Department took over the maintenance of the Detention Center they began addressing \$6 million in maintenance in consideration of the health, safety, and welfare of the detainees and staff. Mr. Finley asked about other jurisdictions joining with Jackson County to make this a regional project. Caleb Clifford, Chief of Staff, said that Troy Schulte, County Administrator, is working on this aspect of the project. Mr. Clifford asked if this topic could be tabled for further discussion when Mr. Schulte could be available.

Discussion.

Brian Gaddie said JCDC Partners, LLC will return to give its next update on August 9, 2020.

Theresa Cass Galvin asked Mary Jo Spino, Clerk of the County Legislature to hand a copy of an email to Frank White, County Executive, as requested by her constituent.

Jalen Anderson, County Legislator, spoke on behalf of Ordinance #5375. He said this action is a call for moral courage that stems from these times we face. We see unrest in our community. This is a difficult decision and we all come here with good intentions. But what we face is bigger than just the statue. It is not just that Andrew Jackson was a bad person or does not represent who we are today. It is about what government truly means to the people it represents and this is a stain on our government. No one here would even consider owning a slave. No one here wants to do these abhorrent things. It is important to remember the people did not vote to place the statues there. The statues belong to the people. But the people put us here to make these difficult decisions. What is the fear that makes us keep these statues up? We need to show the courage to say, keeping these statues is wrong. Mr. Anderson said he prays that this day will change us.

Discussion.

Theresa Cass Galvin, Chairman, expressed her appreciation to Jalen Anderson for speaking passionately on this subject. Frank White, Jr., County Executive, said he also appreciates Mr. Anderson's passion and historical knowledge on this subject. He said this is a body that does not want to do what it is elected to do. Theresa Cass Galvin said that if the voters return a vote to remove the statues she would immediately move to establish an ad hoc committee to determine what will happen to the statues. She said that Mr. Anderson is free to hold town halls prior to the election for public input about the statues.
