Theresa Cass Galvin, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

1 ROLL CALL

2 THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Dan Tarwater III, seconded by Jalen Anderson to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on August 31, 2020. The motion passed by a voice vote.

4 HEARINGS

Bridgette Shaffer, Director of the Jackson County Health Department, gave a presentation regarding the County's response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Ms. Shaffer said that Eastern Jackson County currently has had 6,277 COVID-19 cases and 87 deaths. In the metropolitan area there have been 37,000 COVID-19 cases and 519 deaths. The 14-day rolling positivity average is at 13.8%, but the seven-day average is on the decline.

Ms. Shaffer said the Health Department has hired 62 additional staff to assist with its pandemic response. The office has been balancing the need for immunizations for back to school and COVID testing, but is now moving some staff from its immunization clinic to the testing program so they can now offer COVID testing five days a week with no age limit for testing. The Health Department staff includes 38 full-time disease investigators and six part-time weekend investigators. They have hired three additional epidemiological staff to oversee the investigators. In early August, the state Department of Health and Senior Services rolled out a new software for disease tracking and data reporting. Both Wyandotte and Clay Counties have adopted this program. There have been a few challenges with data reporting as they transition to this new software.

School gating recommendations have been developed as a cooperative effort of local health departments, school superintendents, and Children's Mercy Hospital. The goal has been to offer districts a tool for consistent decision-making across the region. As more information is learned about the virus, these criteria are updated.

The contract tracing approach is to work collaboratively with school district health service leads to provide for an effective contract tracing model.

Ms. Shaffer said there has been confusion over the CDC reports of death data. CDC statistics show that six percent of deaths from COVID-19 were people without underlying health conditions. People with certain health conditions are more vulnerable to complications from this virus, but the virus can also affect people without preexisting health conditions.

Theresa Cass Galvin, County Legislator, said the legislature has received multiple emails and messages from constituents who have children struggling with online learning. The situation feels helpless. Ms. Shaffer said the reopening plan is a decision of the school boards. Ms. Galvin asked about reports that districts could have a misdemeanor against them if they do not follow certain guidelines. Ms. Shaffer said the districts have the flexibility to make their own reopening plans, but there is a mandate regarding wearing masks and the number of people in a location. Ms. Galvin asked about allowing more people inside than are allowed outside. Troy Schulte said they may consider pulling down the allowable limits for indoor groups. They may be restricting the limits on indoor gatherings as long as the County continues to be above 10% red zone infection rate.

Jeanie Lauer, County Legislator, said we will have a backlash to increased restrictions indoors and outdoors. Ms. Lauer asked about notification of parents if a child is determined to be exposed at school. Ms. Shaffer said the schools are sending letters home with students, but contact tracers are also supposed to be contacting parents. Ms. Lauer asked if the Health Department has any authority over the organ transplant programs. Ms. Shaffer said the Health Department does not give hospitals guidance regarding their transplant programs.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, asked who was making decisions

about reopening schools. Ms. Shaffer said individual school districts are making those decisions including how they open. Mr. Finley asked if all districts are open. Ms. Shaffer said all districts in Jackson County are open. Mr. Schulte said that all schools have some students in person, but there is a mix of districts that are hybrid or in person. Mr. Finley asked if there will be a report regarding whether school districts are in person or virtual. Mr. Schulte said the schools' reopening plans would not impact their funding allocation.

Dan Tarwater III, County Legislator, asked about contact tracing. Ms. Shaffer said the Jackson County contact tracers are assisting the Kansas City Health Department. She said her department will be implementing a contact tracing software that will assist with daily follow ups.

Mr. Tarwater said he supports the athletic event issues allowing parents to attend sporting events that are held outside. He encouraged the administration to find a way to work out this issue.

Jalen Anderson, County Legislator, asked about projections for the area getting below the 10% red zone threshold. Ms. Shaffer said they anticipate an increase after the holiday and as more students return to school. She said this also puts a strain on their contact tracing efforts. Ms. Shaffer said the Jackson County Health Department works with other health departments and regional partners in emergency management and hospitals to make determinations as to stay at home orders. Mr. Anderson asked if there have been any outbreaks in schools. Ms. Shaffer said they have seen some outbreaks in schools, but they do not have a report regarding a cluster of cases in schools.

Crystal Williams, County Legislator, said there are entire swaths of parents that are hunkering down and dealing with what we are dealing with this situation. She said it is not fair to just discuss those people that are unhappy about what we are doing. She said it is concentrated groups that complain. In her opinion the County either follows what is best in the public health or not.

Ronald E. Finley asked Bryan Covinsky, County Counselor, about the status of the lawsuit with the Blue Springs School District. Mr. Covinsky said he preferred to discuss this matter in closed session or speak to Mr. Finley individually. A temporary restraining order was filed and the judge has set this matter for trial.

Troy Schulte explained that Ordinance #5394 will cover the costs for PPE and temporary staffing of temperature takers through December 31, 2020. He said they may purchase technology to replace the temperature takers. Dan Tarwater III said he has heard and knows first hand that the contact less thermometers may not be accurate, so temperature taking is not a full proof tool. Troy Schulte agreed and said they are looking at a permanent approach going forward. He confirmed the Truman Courthouse closed this week due to two positive cases of COVID and no one was reported to have had a temperature. Frank White, Jr., County Executive, said he has had a high reading just from being outside in the heat so he realizes that digital thermometers are not the best.

7 FINAL PASSAGE OF PROPOSED ORDINANCES

AN ORDINANCE appropriating \$50,000.00 from the undesignated fund balance of the 2020 CARES Act Fund for use by the Mid-Continent Public Library of Kansas City, MO, to implement a hotspot lending program to facilitate additional internet connectivity for students of higher education in connection with the fight against the ongoing Coronavirus/COVID-19 pandemic and the migration to virtual classrooms for the 2020-2021 school year.

> Dan Tarwater III asked about the agreement that these hotspots would be provided to students with a valid student ID. Jeanie Lauer expressed concern about releasing these funds without reviewing the contract wording. Tony Miller, County Legislator, said he is in favor of releasing these funds if it will assist kids to be connected to the internet. After much discussion, the County Legislature decided to defer action for one week to allow the Administration to finalize the contract and look into Tony Miller's suggestion of giving money to the school districts in Jackson County to leverage receiving a match in grant monies from the State of Missouri.

A motion was made by Jeanie Lauer, seconded by Dan Tarwater III to hold Ordinance #5389. The motion passed by a voice vote.

AN ORDINANCE appropriating \$1,500,000.00 from the undesignated fund balance of the 2020 CARES Act Fund to support an eviction prevention program and authorizing the County Executive to execute a Cooperative Agreement with the United Way of Greater Kansas City for this program, in connection with the fight against the ongoing Coronavirus/COVID-19 pandemic, at a cost to the County not to exceed \$1,500,000.00.

> Jay Haden, Chief Deputy County Counselor, said he spoke with the circuit court counsel and reviewed the CDC order. The information provided is that there is not a federal stay on evictions. Anyone in this situation would still need legal help. Jeanie Lauer said she would prefer to review the contract before moving forward.

Scott Burnett, County Legislator, asked Troy Schulte about the status of our CARES Act funds. Mr. Schulte said of the \$123 million, \$94.5 million has been approved and allocated. There is \$21.1 million remaining, which includes \$10 million as an emergency reserve. He is hopeful there will be a federal extension beyond the December 31, 2020 deadline for contact tracing.
