The County Legislature shall annually appropriate, in connection with the adoption of the annual budget, an amount equal to the annual percentage distribution of all total available Anti-Crime Sales Tax funds. less a 5% unappropriated fund balance pursuant to subsection 9303.(b), which shall include the annual estimated revenue, prior year audited undesignated fund balance, and projected revenues in excess/less than expenditures.", to insert paragraph "b. Annually, in connection with the adoption of the annual budget, an amount equal to 5% of the estimated annual revenue of the Anti-Crime Sales Tax Fund shall be set aside in the undesignated fund balance and not subject to appropriation and not subject to distribution pursuant to the percentage allocation set forth in Schedule I.", to insert the letter "c." before the paragraph starting with the word "Each", to insert paragraph "d. The departments, agencies and/or initiatives within the purposes set forth in Schedule I are subject to modification on an annual basis in connection with the adoption of the annual budget.", to insert paragraph "e. The County Legislature shall review the annual percentage distribution no later than December 31, 2024 and no less often than every four years thereafter," all in Section 9303. on page 3 and 4; to make the following changes to Schedule I in the column titled "Annual % Distribution of Total Available Funds", to delete the number "5" and insert the number "4.5" after the purpose "COMBAT Administration", to delete the number "42" and insert the number "35" after the purpose "COMBAT Programming", to delete the number "10" and insert the number "17" after the purpose "Prosecution", to delete the number "10" and insert the number "11" after the purpose "Judicial", and to delete the number "3" and insert the number "2.5" after the purpose "Medical" all on page 5.
