Caleb Clifford, Chief of Staff said County Executive Frank White Jr. was not able to attend due to a personal matter. He referred to Executive Order #20-22 which appoints Ms. Sylvya Stevenson as the Chief Administrative Officer. He said she will be present at the first legislative meeting in January 2021.

He advised the Legislature that they are monitoring developments in Washington, D.C. related to the most recent COVID stimulus plan. He said it is their understanding that there are no direct funds (Coronavirus relief funds) in the same manner that we received earlier this year. However, there may be targeted purpose funds that we may have access to but we are waiting for the language of the bill. He said there may be a vote tonight. They will keep the Legislature updated on this issue. On

### 10 INTRODUCTION OF PROPOSED ORDINANCES AND ASSIGNMENT TO COMMITTEE

Troy Schulte, County Administrator, said Ordinance #5476 was the last of the funds designated for cities. Lone Jack and Sugar Creek were below the 5,000 person threshold for an allocation of funds from the CARES Act. The County agreed to reimburse them for expenses incurred. Sugar Creek started out with a \$13,000.00 allocation and Lone Jack started out with a \$5,100.00 allocation. Both cities subsequently came back with additional expenses related to CARES Act for a total amount of \$142,000.00.

Troy Schulte explained that Ordinance #5477 and a subsequent ordinance are contingent funding issues in the event that the federal government does not extend the deadline of the CARES Act. There is pending legislation that would extend the deadline from December 30, 2020 to December 31, 2021 which would make this ordinance unnecessary. In the event the federal government does not extend the deadline, the County will move costs associated with our Corrections Department eligible for reimbursement under the CARES Act guideline. Salaries and benefit costs for the Corrections Department will be moved to the CARES Act funds to free up the General Fund dollars that we would then have for pandemic related expenses such as the Health Department building after January 1, 2021. If the deadline is extended, this Ordinance will not be effective per the last sentence in the legislation.

# 13 UNFINISHED BUSINESS

County Executive Veto Message for Ordinance #5440.

Ronald E. Finley said at the last meeting he inquired what was being done as far as providing personal protective equipment (PPE) to nursing homes. He asked Mr. Schulte to explain what has been done to date.

Mr. Schulte said at the request of Mr. Finley, they contacted the nursing homes in Jackson County letting them know additional PPE is available. They are making arrangements to get supplies distributed.

Mr. Finley said he understood they had masks, hand sanitizer and gloves available. He thanked Mr. Schulte for his assistance with this effort. He said they discovered 24 nursing homes that were eligible to receive PPE.

Ronald E. Finley said he sent an email this morning to the County Legislature with a thank you letter from Harvesters Community Food Network indicating the significant impact the money provided by the county has had on the program. He said 17% of Jackson County residents identify as food insecure and 22% of children are food insecure. Harvesters is reporting that they have distributed more than 20 million pounds of food (17 million meals) which is an increase of nearly 5 million pounds over the same period in 2019. They have been spending more than \$300,000.00 per month to purchase food to distribute in Jackson County, Missouri. They have 300 partner agencies assisting in food distribution. He anticipates we will need to continue this work over the next year regarding this crisis. He appreciates the continued attention of the Legislature and their support for Harvesters.

Charlie Franklin, County Legislator, thanked Judge Byrn for his service as Presiding Judge and said the County Legislature has enjoyed working with him. Dan Tarwater, County Legislator, thanked the judge for working well with the Administration on the repairs at the courthouse. He said he appreciates his frankness, tenacity and ability to work with the County Legislature and the County Executive.

Judge Byrn thanked the Legislature and the Executive for their countless hours on behalf of the citizens of Jackson County. He encouraged them to walk through floors 4-6 of the Kansas City courthouse to look at the renovations. He said he appreciates the County's support and extends his gratitude on behalf of the courts. He said it has been quite memorable.

Theresa Cass Galvin said she appreciates all his hard work over the past two years dealing with the water damage and then the pandemic.

#### 14 NEW BUSINESS

Manuel Buffa came forward from the audience. He said he sent an email to the County Legislature and the County Executive regarding his son who attends school in the Raytown School District. His concern is that his teenager is actively regressing due to the lack of socialization. He said he received an email last week stating that secondary education would not be back in the classroom until March 5, 2021. He said the school board and superintendent of Raytown Schools directed him to contact Jackson County since they set the rules.

Caleb Clifford said the rules forJackson County related to schools are guidance, they are not required. Regarding the issue being discussed on quarantine procedures, he said the Jackson County Health Department, Kansas City Health Department as well as others, due to the prevalence of the disease in our community, have not recommended that institutions go to the shortened option for quarantine. The health departments still recommend the full 14 day period. Each school district is allowed to create their own rules as it relates to returning to school.

Theresa Cass Galvin asked for his phone number so she can discuss it more with him.

Dan Tarwater III asked for Mr. Buffa's email address so he could respond.
