The project is running smoothly and on schedule. Dr. Nash said the team continues to work remotely and practice social distancing effectively. With respect to the MBE and WBE goals, they continue to meet those goals and work with the County's Compliance Department. They are on track with quarterly goals. 14 NEW BUSINESS

Jeanie Lauer, County Legislator, asked about the vaccine schedule for the County. Troy Schulte, County Administrator, said they are still working through tier 1A. The issue is the availability of vaccines. He said Truman Medical Centers (TMC) has obtained more vaccines than the Jackson County Health Department. The Administration is working through all available avenues to get people vaccinated through whatever source is available. He said there is a struggle with coordinating between the entities that are administering vaccines. People are encouraged to sign up for the vaccine survey, but there are likely duplicates between Jackson County, TMC, and Kansas City vaccine lists. Mr. Schulte said they have the capacity to administer 1,000 shots per day, but they do not have enough vaccines available. They are looking at regional sites, such as the sports complex to scale up the vaccinations, but they will not receive any vaccines this week.

Jeanie Lauer also asked about hearings before the Missouri House last

week related to public health matters. Dan Tarwater III said he thinks the County's lobbyist agreement should be before the Legislature next week. They hope to have our lobbyists involved with these issues before the Missouri House.

Jalen Anderson asked about the availability of vaccines in the County. Mr. Schulte said he believes the bottleneck is with the federal government and its supply to the state. TMC had an established connection with its health care provider network that enabled it to obtain some vaccines. Mr. Anderson said he believes there are five bills before the House related to public health matters. He said there were only two people to speak to the bills before the Missouri Senate.

Theresa Cass Galvin, County Legislator, said the Missouri Association of Counties had a meeting last week, but there were no discussions about this specific legislation. Caleb Clifford, Chief of Staff, said the Administration is also concerned about the proposal to strip away local control for public health issues. He also said the County has administrated over 4,500 vaccine. No new vaccines came this week, but the second vaccine will be available to those who have already received the first dose.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, asked about plans for educating the public about the importance of getting vaccinated. Mr. White said there are discussions about a marketing and education plan.
