Charlie Franklin, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Dan Tarwater III, seconded by Jeanie Lauer to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on March 14, 2022. The motion passed by a voice vote.

4 HEARINGS

Josh Campbell, Executive Director, Missouri Energy Initiative, and Crystal Crawford, Vice President, Oversight and Program Development, Ygrene, presented information regarding the Show Me PACE (Property Assessed Clean Energy) program. Dan Tarwater III, County Legislator, asked if this organization is responsible for financing these home improvements. Ms. Crawford said that is correct, Ygrene is responsible for financing projects. She said the approval is not based on a person's credit score, but is determined by homeowner's ability to pay. Mr. Tarwater asked Frank White, Jr., County Executive, if the Administration is in favor of this program. Mr. White said their greatest concerns have been about residential properties more than commercial. He is concerned that if people default on their loan the County will be required to evict people or foreclose on property because of a delinguency. Ms. Crawford said their organization monitors delinguent taxes. Their policy is to work with homeowners, offer credit counseling and make hardship provisions. It is their policy to not foreclose. Mr. Tarwater said that if a property owner doesn't make a payment, what becomes the County's responsibility? Ms. Crawford said the company will work with the County Collector. She said St. Louis also had these questions but eventually voted to expand the program. Dan Tarwater III asked what is meant by the "escalation rate" in the materials. Ms. Crawford said the company refers to any complaint or inquiry from a customer as an escalation. Their escalation rate is less than 1%. Mr. Tarwater asked about the next steps. Charlie Franklin, County Legislator, said that will be up to the Administration. Caleb Clifford, Chief of Staff, said the Administration needs to review the specifics of the program. Their concerns are primarily with residential customers. The County Counselor's Office will need to review the language in the ordinance.

Jalen Anderson, County Legislator, said the Administration has done its

diligence in assisting these residents and in dealing with the struggles each person had in finding their next place to live.
