RESOLUTION 12158, April 6, 1998

INTRODUCED BY Dixie M. Flynn, County Legislator

WHEREAS, by Ordinance 2791, dated March 9, 1998, the Legislature did appropriate \$163,958.00 in grant funds received from the Missouri Department of Public Safety for the Prosecuting Attorney's KC Stop Violence Network Program; and,

WHEREAS, under this program, the County Prosecuting Attorney's Office and City Law and Neighborhood and Community Services Departments form a network to counteract domestic violence; and,

WHEREAS, under the grant application, the City was to receive an amount not to exceed \$67,057.00, to fund an advocate/volunteer coordinator and two part-time prosecutor positions; and,

WHEREAS, the attached Cooperative Agreement for Services provides a suitable mechanism by which these funds can be disbursed to the City; and,

WHEREAS, the execution of this Agreement is in the best interests of the health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of the County; now therefore,
