RESOLUTION # 14080, March 18, 2002

INTRODUCED BY Victor E. Callahan and Ronald E. Finley, County Legislators

WHEREAS, the members of the Legislature extends their deepest sympathy to family and friends of Booker T. Wright, who departed this life on March 1, 2002, at Baptist Medical Center; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Wright was born in Kansas City, Missouri, on July 28, 1947, one of three children born to the union of Thelma and Booker T. Wright, Sr; and,

WHEREAS, he was a life-long resident of Kansas City, attended W. W. Yates Elementary School, and graduated from Manual High School; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Wright was an advocate for consumers of mental health services and other disenfranchised persons; and,

WHEREAS, he served on the Wyandotte County Mental Health Services Advisory Board and with several other neighborhood advisory boards and advocacy groups; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Wright served on various committees of Freedom Incorporated and as a freedom
